Yellow keys are *dead keys**, used in combination with another keystroke to produce diacritical marks.

Examples

 η To produce an *eta* with an acute accent, make sure the Greek Polytonic keyboard is selected, then type q followed by h.

 $\tilde{\eta}$ To get an *eta* with a circumflex and a iota subscript, type *AltGr+[* (left bracket) followed by *h*.

'H To produce a capital *eta* with a rough breathing mark, type *Shift*+'(apostrophe) followed by *Shift*+*h*.

A dead key can still be used to create the character normally produced by that key. Just follow the dead keystroke with a space.

Example

(C) If you want to produce a double quotation mark (handy when searching for a Greek phrase), type *Shift+* (apostrophe) followed by *Spacebar*.

* Dead keys derive their name from their behavior: when you strike a dead key no character appears on the screen.
